Thus far she has made animal figures such as a dolphin and an owl, while exploring the human form in the guise of a gnome and a mermaid. These have been glazed and fired in the kiln. They are very striking and full of character. She has recently done a series on the idea of a baby dragon breaking out of its shell. Various stages are represented, from the whole egg through to the dragon emerging. The colours are bold and beautiful.



It has been an exciting and nerve wracking journey for Amelia as she hopes for success each time a group of figurines goes into the kiln. The models are initially a dull, greenish colour from

the food dye glaze mix when they enter the kiln. You have no sense of the bright colours they will end up being, as you close the door and begin the firing.

There is great expectation as we open the door after the firing, eager to see how they turned out. You can imagine the elation when everything is transformed into richly adorned and brightly coloured works, safely through the firing and ready for display.

On Wednesday, we enjoyed a sunny but chilly day painting the landscapes on Mitre rock. Then we enjoyed a picnic lunch near the top, looking at the beautiful spring views of canola fields and lush green grass.

We then spent our Thursday in two groups; with one group doing multi-pitch up to 55 metres and the other group doing some more challenging 'top ropes'. It was a fun afternoon watching people face their fears, engaging their strength and using their courage in this epic activity. It was quite amusing to see people hanging in the air in their harnesses. We then headed to a nearby Natimuk and bonded over some delicious wood fired pizza made by us in the community pizza oven!

On the journey homeward, we stopped to drop off a food donation to the Djab-Wurrung embassy where they

are protesting to save sacred trees and land from being destroyed in order to build a road.

Over all, it was an incredibly cheerful week of adventure, history and fear facing. We all enjoyed ourselves while testing our limits and immersing ourselves in nature.
